## News Broadcast Project

- For the next project you will be in groups of 3 (one group of 4), you will be tasked with writing and producing your own feature news broadcast.
- Video is due on Dec. 24, 2020
- You may choose to report on any topic.
- Your broadcast should be between 4-5 mins in length
  - 5-6 mins in length for group of 4
  - Make sure each group member gets a chance to speak.

- For your broadcast you will need:
  - 1. Divide the speaking roles:
    - 1 or 2 reporters
    - At least 2 subjects to interview
      - You can decide who does which role
      - You can play multiple roles during the broadcast
  - 2. Include "B" footage to make your video interesting.
  - 3. Don't forget to answer the 5w1h during your video.
